Hello Agile and Scrum Enthusiasts,

Last month we talked about what type of questions to expect during an interview for a Scrum Master position. More importantly you should know what questions YOU should ASK when interviewing with a company. I have interviewed a lot of people, and I usually start the interview with explaining the position and the team structure. At the end of the interview, I ask, "Do you have any questions for me?" I find most Scrum Masters say, "None that I can think of. You already answered my questions." This answer or a similar answer is usually indicative of one of the three things listed below:

- 1. You understand everything very clearly, and there are no questions or unknowns left to answer.
- 2. You are desperate for the position, and will take it no matter what.
- a. So, no point in asking any questions, right? Probably not. Many-a-times, we make the mistake of taking up a job that is not right.
- b. Many years ago, when I was at the beginning of my career, I was offered a lead role for an engineering team, with a promise to travel overseas in under 6 months. Only catch was the company wanted to keep my original qualifications and passport till they sent me on an overseas project. I was young, naïve, and desperate, and wanted to take the job. But my Uncle stopped me from taking that job, saying I will not be happy there.
- c. You should always think through what you are getting into. Ask yourself, if I was not desperate, will I take this job?
- 3. You do not have experience working in this position, and do not know what questions to ask.
- a. Whether you realize it or not, if you do not ask any questions, you make the interviewer think about your experience and credibility.
